AEA Ministries held its 59th Anniversary Annual National Meeting

Pastors and leaders from all around the country - and literally, from all around the world - gathered in Washington, DC over the weekend of April 27-28th to celebrate the 59th Anniversary of the American Evangelistic Association.

Saturday events, held at the AEA Ministries' chartered "Refuge of Hope Disciple Center", an inner-city ministry, helping to bring the hope and healing of Jesus Christ to the projects just 8 blocks from our nation's capital, included the annual Men of Standard and Sister to Sister Conference proceedings.

Speakers included Darara Gubo, of the St. Thomas University, Miami Florida, who spoke extensively on the plight of the Church and Human Rights, as well as Attorney Tiffany Barrans, the International Legal Director of the American Center for Law and Justice (ACLJ), who has been fighting for the release of AEA Pastor Saeed Abedini, an American citizen, who has been imprisoned since last summer, in a notoriously evil prison inside Iran for preaching the Gospel.

The after lunch sessions included an address by medical doctor Dr. Samuel Alleyne, who gave an impassioned talk about "Living a Life of Joy and Health", and special session featuring AEA Ministers Bishop Charles and Prophet Judy Farmer speaking on recognizing the Apostate Church.

AEA Ministries guests were treated to lunch provided by the Refuge of Hope, as well as the opportunity for seeing the many excellent sites in the Washington DC area, including the National Portrait Gallery.

Sunday events, featuring the AEA Ministries/Refuge of Hope 59th Anniversary/23rd Anniversary, respectively, Annual Banquet, were held at the beautiful Channel Inn, nestled along the shores of the Potomac River. In an afternoon filled with great music, great praise, and great fellowship, various speakers engaged the packed room, including special presentations from Rachel Chen, the Director of Human Resources from Seneca One Finance; Ms. Evelyn Minor, Director of the Senior Nutrition Program, and Attorney Paul Comfort of the Chesapeake Bible College.

Pastor Eric Trimble's Licensing Ceremony, April 28, 2013

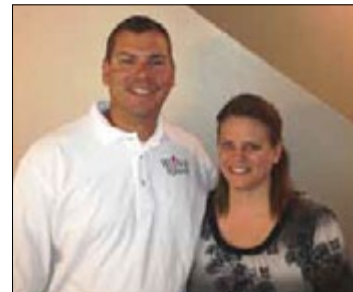

Also, meeting a physical need opens the door to share with others the hope of Jesus, and let them know that they are loved and that He is the reason Within Reach does what it does.

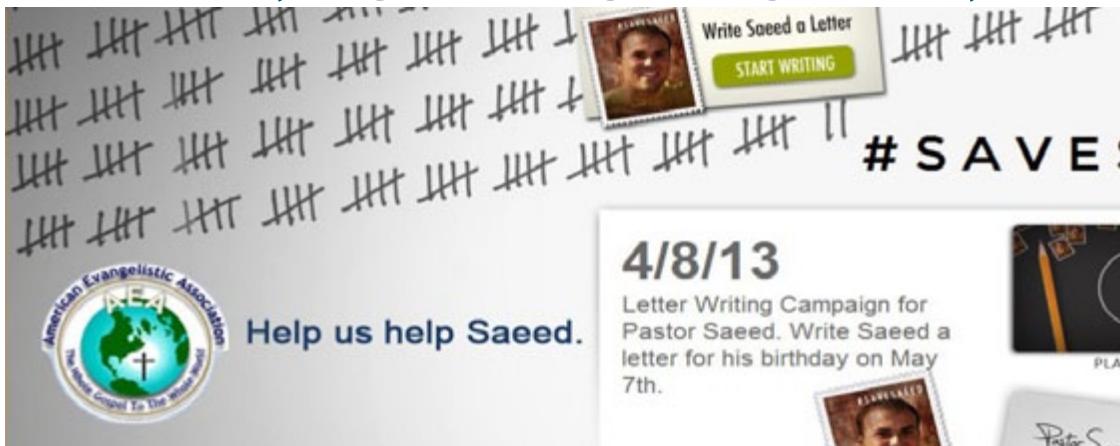
In May, the ministry travels to Paraguay on a mission journey and will seek every open door to evangelize.

Pastor Saeed From Iranian Prison: Thanks for "Praying and Fighting for my Freedom"

American Pastor Saeed Abedini's family in Terhan was able to visit him again earlier this week.

Pastor Saeed was able to get a new letter out this week to his wife Naghmeh. He sent her this letter to be shared with supporters who gathered recently, on the Christian day of Pentecost, to pray for him.

He shared that despite what he has to endure on a daily basis – the beatings and internal bleeding – he has hope. The 33-year-old U.S. citizen wrote, "I will also be freed from my chains though prayer and strength of the Grace of God."

His full letter to supporters is below.

Spending Pentecost in Prison and in Chains

When the Day of the Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. (Acts 2:1-2)

One special day, one heart, and one place -- All of these come together, to emphasize one thing, the importance of unity.

I heard that the persecution, my arrest and imprisonment has united churches from different denominations, from different cities and countries that would never come together because of their differences. That the churches have united together in prayer to put one request (my freedom) on one day (Pentecost) before God.

You don't know how happy I was in the Lord and rejoiced knowing that in my chains the body of Christ has chained together and is brought to action and prayer.

When someone's life like mine is in danger, we realize how different we are in our opinions

(although some of those differences might be correct), but that we are still united in one goal of praying for my freedom.

I am thankful for that. It is through your prayers and the Grace of God that the Lord is using me here in my chains. Many have been freed from the chains of Satan here and have been saved and added to the Church.

Now, how beautiful it will be if the Church would be united and fight for the salvation of the world whose life is in danger and who is bound in chains of Satan and to fight for the salvation of the world, a world that is heading to the way of destruction. With the same passion and the same way that you are praying and fighting for my freedom, we need to be praying and fighting for the salvation of the world.

When the Church is united (with one heart, in one place, on one day) that is when the joy and strength of God (Holy Spirit) wants to come in that unity and pour out and the Lord be exalted. Although this unity is the result of direct involvement of the Holy Spirit that is able to bring many different characteristics to make one.

But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me (Acts 1:8).

And only when the Holy Spirit comes can you get strength. Without the strength of God it is impossible to do the will of God. And when we receive strength, then we can be transformed. And when we are transformed, that is when the Church is transformed as well. And when the Church is transformed, then the world will be freed from the chains of sin and will be saved and transformed. When we are all united and chained together, united in our hearts, in one place in one day, and we pray, then we will receive the power from on High and will receive strength and the world will be changed and will

be freed from the chains of bondage and will be saved. The same way that I will also be freed from my chains though prayer and strength of the Grace of God.

So dear sisters and brothers let us be united in prayer for freedom and salvation of the world. Let us be united so that the Holy Spirit might fall on us and the Glory of God would be revealed through us and through the church.

Welcome to the chains that have bound me and have bound us together. Happy Pentecost.
